

Clicker Resources for the 2026 Bookbug Primary 1 Family Bag Books

What are the Clicker Resources?

We have created two different Clicker Sets for each book, to support early writing activities. The Clicker Sets can each be opened with Clicker software for Windows devices and Clicker Writer app for iOS and Chromebook.



Simple Sentence Writing Set

This is a Clicker Sentence Set which contains all the words for building a model sentence with an accompanying picture. This allows learners to create ten simple sentences re- telling the the story.

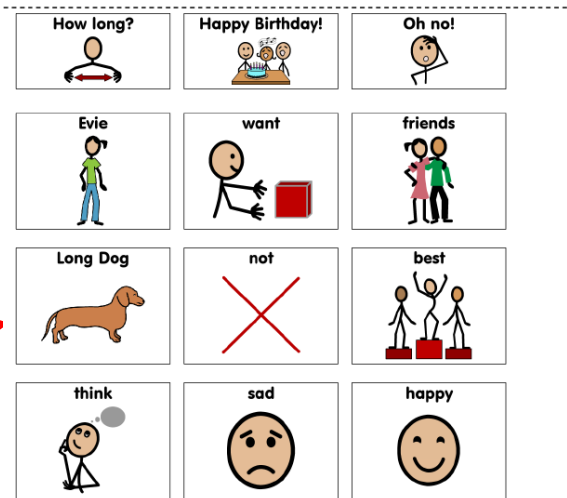

For learners moving on from an early writing level, alternative sentence model options are available for each sentence, by selecting Clicker Set and edit. The

image above shows the *View & Copy* option, where the sentence model is always in view, (this is the default setting for the sentence sets.)

The simple sentences have been designed to link with and be used alongside the symbol communication boards, which support discussion around the stories.

Book Review Sentence Set

A Clicker Connect Set is also available, which is a 'next step' for Clicker Sentences users and provides learners with clusters of words, phrases and pictures to help them build a coherent piece of text. This allows learners to create simple sentences to review the book content, say what they liked, imagine their actions if they were a character in the story or how they will put new information learned to use.

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Opening the Clicker Grids sets in Clicker on your Windows Device/PC

On your device, go to Symbols for All/Bookbug website, Primary 1 family bag (2026), select the Clicker set name to download.



This should then open automatically in Clicker. Save the grid set in *My Documents* or other location on your device/PC.

Opening the Grids sets in Clicker Writer on your iOS device/iPad/Chromebook

On your iPad or Chromebook, go to Symbols for All/Bookbug website, Primary 1 family bag (2026), select the grid set name to download.



Select Download, which will save the grid set to the Files app on your iPad or Chromebook. Open the Files app, go to the Downloads folder, select the grid set name, which should then open automatically in the Clicker Writer app.

Accessibility

The Clicker Sets are accessible by mouse, touchscreen, roller ball, switch and eye gaze, as well as other alternative access options for your device.
